Update on developments within the home

- We currently have no lift as you all may be aware, this is going to be replace but will take some time for a new lift to be built, we thank you all for your patience and apologise for any inconvenience caused. If you are struggling with using the stairs, please do not hesitate to use the chair lifts. We should be able to update you more in the next couple of weeks with dates and how we will manage the lift replacement in the home
- Paul has Started to paint the hallway downstairs and I hope you agree this is already starting to look great.
- Decorating plan we still continue to decorate bedrooms and we are slowly making our way around. There have also been some changes to the reception area which now looks more inviting. We plan to move into the dining room and complete the first-floor corridor in the near future
- We are adapting the dining room so that we can have a space where the residents can (if they choose to) do more meaningful activities. This will involve a work surface and a sink area that has already been started and looks great!

We still wish to develop the garden and front of the home.
