Development of the Home:

We have now decorated our ground floor hallway, we are just in the process of ordering the carpet so it should all be completed very soon. We hope you like the wallpaper!

We then aim to decorate the upstairs hallway.

We will endeavor to keep the disruption to a minimum.

We have been very fortunate, and relatives have been looking into possible new projects for the residents of St Johns Court. One of the projects is a silent call bell system, relatives JK & BS have kindly been speaking with different charities. Fortunately, for us, the Rotary club Bromsgrove have kindly donated £3000, which we can put towards the silent call bell system. We have a new care planning system implemented and the silent call bell system can be incorporated into this new system. Once the PCS is up and running, there is a possibility the trust will look into initiating the call bell system.

Speaking to charities JK & BS found out that there are also charities that are able to support individuals who may be struggling and we felt this might be of benefit mentioning in the recent residents and relatives meeting and the newsletter. United Bromsgrove Charity support individuals who may be struggling financially, having to work to support loved ones in the care home environment.



THINGS TO LOOK OUT FOR AT ST JOHNS COURT

- We are working towards a whole home approach which involves having protected meal times. This means that the staff put all their focus on residents enjoying lunch time between 12:45 and 13:45hrs. It is important for residents to have enjoyment of their food but also those needing that extra bit of support are given that extra time and attention. Overall, we are aiming for everyone to have increased appetite and enjoyment of his or her meals. Family members who are visiting are more than welcome to be involved supporting their loved one. We will be planning in training sessions on nutrition, supporting with meals and dysphagia, which if anyone wanted to attend please speak to Faye or Claire.
- Ben has been working on a magazine of residents life biographies including fond memories and stories they have of their life. This is going to be an excellent read so be sure to have a read. Ben is

hoping to have this completed very soon.
