Now the knitting club is meeting perhaps some more of you will start knitting. I find size 8 (4mm) needles with double knitting wool gives a good result making a 6in. Square. You can do any pattern you like but plain is fine; most people do stocking stitch (one line of purl then one line of plain.)
